



1DV800 – Computer Graphics

Assignments Overview

Welcome to 1DV800, the Computer Graphics course of Linnaeus University!

This document describes the rules of the course and some information you need to know in order to finish the course successfully.

- The evaluation of the course consists of 4 (four) *theoretical* assignments and 3 (three) *practical* assignments.
- Each assignment (in both categories) will be graded A-F, and you need to pass **all of them** to receive the final course grade. To pass an assignment you need a grade larger than F, which means you have to collect **at least 60% of points** of that specific assignment.
- For each individual assignment you pass, you are awarded 1 credit (with the exception of the 1st *practical* assignment, which is worth 1.5 credits). These count towards the course's total of 7.5 credits. In case you do not finish the course, but successfully pass some of the assignments, you can reuse the credits you got if you take the course again in the future.
- Every assignment has to be submitted by its deadline to the **Moodle assignment submission system** at <https://mymoodle.lnu.se/course/view.php?id=48982>. E-mail submission attempts will be ignored!
- Assignments that receive a positive grade ($\geq 60\%$ of points) are graded only once (i.e., no second chance for improving a positive grade).
- There will be a retake for late/failed assignments shortly after the final deadline. The penalty for the retake submissions is that the top limit of grades for such assignments will be set to 90% of points.
- You collect points during the course by passing each assignment. The total amount of points is 200: 100 points for *theoretical* assignments and 100 points for *practical* assignments. In order to pass the course **you need to collect at least 60 points in each category**. If you fail one (either the *theoretical* or the *practical*), you fail the course.
- Your final course grade is an ECTS grade that is a combination of the grades received for assignments:

$$\text{Points} = \text{Theoretical_Total} * 0.5 + \text{Practical_Total} * 0.5$$

The table of points/grade dependency is as follows:

Points	≥ 60	≥ 70	≥ 80	≥ 90	≥ 95
Grade	E	D	C	B	A
